General Meeting

November 19, 2018

Grants

Nicole Morgan read from the 2018-2019 Mission Statement regarding grants.

- Running Club- presented by Kelsey Dean and Jenna Thoresen. Running Club has been running for 12 years. In addition to promoting health, it also builds leadership skills. The current year Cocurricular Budget will not cover the change in pay from January to current salary rates. (Teachers received a salary increase before the beginning of the school year.) They are asking for the difference in pay for 5 teachers for 25 hours. The amount is \$1082.75. MOTION: by Katrina Rockey, moves to approve the grant for \$1082.75 to be paid to Briarwood Elementary school. Motion seconded; vote. No oppose or abstentions. MOTION PASSES.
- <u>Music-</u> presented by Reanne Nakapaahu. The Music department would like to purchase Boom Whackers, pitched PVC pipes. These will be used to teach timing, pitch, and melody. These will be used for grades K-5. The amount for 30 sets of Boom Whackers is \$609.53. MOTION: by Desiree Mostrom, moves to approve the amount of \$609.53 to purchase 30 sets of Boom Whackers. Motion seconded; vote. No oppose and one abstention. MOTION PASSES.
- Robotics- presented by Anne Miller. This is the second season of First Lego League at Briarwood. Students gain STEM knowledge, research skills, programing skills, etc. Club participation is capped to 30 members because of limited resources. Club meets once a week for 2 hours. Season at Briarwood runs September to the beginning of December. All club members are required to participate in all areas of the competition. Families are asked to pay a fee of \$25 to offset costs. Club has received money from ISF, Boeing, and OSPI. Anne is asking for an additional \$500 from the PTA to add to the Robotics Club budget. This will be an annual ask. MOTION: by Megan Raak, moves to approve the grant of \$500. Motion seconded; vote. No oppose and 4 abstentions. MOTION PASSES.
- <u>Math Support-</u> presented by Monique Cabellon. Monique is asking for grant funds to purchase Digi Blocks. These will be used to help struggling students with number sense. It will help K-5 conceptualize numbers. At present, it will be used to serve 43 students, but any teacher will be allowed to use. The amount for the Digi Blocks is \$793.50. **MOTION:** by Michelle Slaver, moves to approve the grant amount of \$793.50 to purchase Digi Blocks. Motion seconded, vote. No oppose or abstentions. MOTION PASSES.
- <u>Kindergarten Conference</u>- presented by Kelsey Smith and Dana Geist. Kelsey and Dana would like to attend the "Get Your Teach On" in Phoenix the weekend of January 19 21. This conference will teach

strategies on how to engage student more effectively while teaching. Kelsey and Dana will provide a Professional Development training to any staff who are interested in also learning those strategies. A date will be provided to the PTA, once scheduled, to show accountability.

- o Option A- Asking for \$700.98 for two registration fees.
- Option B- Asking for \$350.49 for one registration fee. Kelsey has access to private funding to pay for her registration cost.

MOTION: by Desiree Mostrom, moves to approve Option B, \$350.49 to cover the cost of one registration fee. Kelsey and Dana must provide one Professional Development by March with a shareable presentation in order to receive grant monies. Motion seconded; vote. No oppose or abstentions. MOTION PASSES.

• <u>ELL-</u> presented by Mei Yee Tam. Mei Yee is asking for grant funds to purchase books in multiple languages. These will be used to serve 25-30 students. However, anyone may use them, K-5. They will promote biliteracy and inclusion. Mei Yee is asking for \$193.77 to purchase books. **PTA will use** *All for Books* funds to cover the majority of the cost. There is \$167.36 available in the fund. That leaves \$26.41 to be covered by a grant. **MOTION:** by Michelle Splaver, moves to approve the grant amount of \$26.41 to purchase books. Motion seconded; vote. No oppose or abstentions. MOTION PASSES.
