- School Improvement Report:
 - 2nd highest growth of all 15 elementary schools
 - Focused on goal for children with IEP's especially in math
 - Last year 17% of children with IEP's had passed math goal was to double it
 - \circ $\;$ This year goal met 35% of children with IEP's had passed math
 - Goal next year to bring it up to 50%
- Kindergarten Registration gearing up Feb 3rd is parent education night
- Parent Education night at the next meeting (2/24) for Mental Health and Anxiety presented by Belma Martin and IVE counselor
- IReady Pilot continuing 12 teachers did personal development in the fall, 20 more signed up for next session
- 2 special ed para positions still open
- ASAP began this week 2 math classes and 1 ELL class getting harder to staff with school day shifted later so anticipate a revisiting of the program and how to be the most impactful

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- Issaquah City Council approved Providence Point preliminary school plan anticipate rebordering committee this summer
